I hope that everyone had a safe break and we look forward to welcoming the students back tomorrow morning. Staff have been busy engaged in professional development activities today.

Reports

Reports were emailed to parents on the last Wednesday of last term. Please remember that the report link only remains active for four weeks, so you need to save the electronic copy of the report somewhere safe. Please contact the front office if you have not received the report link via email (please check your junk or spam folders first).

Attendance

Some parents would have noticed a comment on their child's report regarding attendance falling below 90% during the first semester.

Learning in class is sequential and it is therefore important that students attend school each and every day. If they miss lessons in a sequence this can lead to them missing critical information in the lesson sequence.

I appreciate that students cannot attend school when they are sick, but we are seeing many other reasons for non-attendance. The table below shows how non-attendance can add up over the years of schooling:

1 or 2 days a week doesn't seem like much but...

If your child misses	That equals	Which is	And over 13 years of schooling that's
