All students in Year 4 will sit the test unless parents have notified the school in writing that they do not want them to. The school will be notified by the end of the year if any students qualify for the program in 2018.

Attendance Certificates

One of our priorities is to maintain good attendance at school. Students missing just one day per fortnight will miss around a year and a half of schooling by the time they reach Year 12. We know that high attendance at school provides more opportunities for student success. Students who had an attendance rate of 98% or higher in Term Two will be receiving a certificate this week.
