Behaviour Management Policy

As highlighted in last week's newsletter, the school board has recently approved our Behaviour Management Policy that now includes a 'good standing' provision. Late last year, the Minister for Education issued the 'Let's Take a Stand Together' document which highlighted behaviour management in schools. It required all schools to implement a Good Standing Policy by the end of 2019. I have attached our new policy together with the original Minister's statement for your reference.

Our Good Standing processes will be implemented during Term 3 and to facilitate this, we will be holding whole school rewards on a fortnightly basis (weekly for Pre-primary and Kindergarten) for those students maintaining good standing. When a student loses good standing, parents will be notified and the student will not take part in the next reward and will have reflection time with school admin.
