Martinstag is named after St. Martin, a Roman soldier who was a good man and showed great care and compassion towards his fellow people. According to the legend, he cut his cloak in half to share with a beggar during a snowstorm.

On the 11 November it is a tradition in for children in many parts of Germany to participate in a procession of paper lanterns in remembrance of St. Martin. In kindergarten and in school, they make their own lanterns and then gather on city streets to sing songs dedicated to Martinstag.


We are also going to celebrate *Martinstag* in our school next term. Stay tuned for the date and we hope to see you there.



Why German? Warum Deutsch? DE

Baldivis Gardens Values Fair Go

The third value of our school is a fair go – to pursue and protect the common good where all people are treated fairly for a just society. Schools are a society in itself as we model and instil the values we would like to see in the wider community. A 'fair go' is an iconic Australian statement harking back to the Queensland Shearers' Strike of 1891 that eventually led to the Australian Labor Party being formed in 1901.

For me a 'fair go' is everyone has the opportunity to improve their circumstances. This is not about the rich getting richer but ensuring we place a value on fairness over being equal. Aristotle stated, 'the worst form of inequality is to try to make unequal things equal'. The right to a fair go is a value of equity where everyone is given what they need to be successful. This is seen in the 400 metre race at our recent faction carnival. Rather than everyone starting on the same line, meaning that those on the outside lane have to run further, the starting lines are staggered so everyone has the same distance to achieve.

At Baldivis Gardens PS we place an importance on giving each student the tools and knowledge they need to be successful. This can be through the variety of programs we offer, the extension and support provided in each lesson, teachers knowing each student and the strengths that they bring to school each day.
