#### Some Interesting Research

Your involvement in your child's schooling WILL make a difference in how well they do at school. There is research and studies to back this up. This is an excerpt from some recent research carried out by the Commissioner for Children and Young People. 1,812 West Australian students participated in this research and the findings are both compelling and thought provoking for teachers and parents alike.

Some of the findings included:

The attitudes and behaviours of family members influenced student engagement with school and learning for students across all year levels.

Students described the varied ways in which family members acted that were both supportive and unsupportive of their engagement.

Family members were noted as positively influencing engagement with school and learning when they:

 show interest in and encourage learning progress (not just academic achievement)

- provide motivation, understanding and support with practical, emotional and academic matters
- directly participate in school activities or communicate with the school regarding learning.

Students valued family members taking an active interest in their life through proactively asking about school, learning and how they feel and, critically, listening to their response and respecting their views. These actions showed family members cared about students and their learning, and emphasised the importance of learning and school. Importantly, this was not about family members knowing the answers to homework questions for example, but about spending quality time talking and listening to the student.

Our school's Vision acknowledges the importance of parents and staff sharing the responsibility for our students' growth and development. We are keen to work in partnership with our parent community to ensure the very best outcomes for your children.
