Please Look After our Library Books

Dear Parents

Reading is one of the most important skills your child will learn at school. Like all skills, improvement comes with practice, and the Baldivis Gardens school library provides a wide variety of books for students to borrow for reading practice, information, and enjoyment.

Your child's class visits the school library weekly to select books to take home. You can help your children by reading these books to them or encouraging them to read independently. Don't forget to ask them some questions about what they are reading.

Students are responsible in handling all library books with care, since they are for everyone to share. We would really appreciate your support in encouraging every child to use a library bag. Unfortunately there is always the risk of liquid spills and if books were stored in a waterproof bag hopefully this kind of damage would be eliminated. The school office has waterproof library bags for only \$8. If a book is in need of a little repair please tell me or another staff member. If you come across a book with torn or loose pages please do not repair it yourself with sticky tape. Return it to the library and let me know where the torn or loose pages are and I will repair it in a special way that will make the book look good as new. If a book is lost or damaged, payment towards a replacement will be requested from the parents.

Library books may be kept for one week (K - 1) or two weeks (Year 2 – 6), then must be returned to be renewed (checked out again) if the student is not finished reading it. An overdue (late) book means a student cannot borrow another book until the overdue book is renewed or returned. If your family plans to move from Baldivis Gardens please remember to return all books before moving. We hope your student will enjoy reading many books from our school library and grow in reading skills while attending our school. If you have any questions or concerns about the library, please feel free to contact me.
